Homer Smith French Jr. was born in Hanford Village, Ohio, a neighborhood of Columbus and attended and graduated from Columbus East High School. Although he was not on the school's basketball team that won the State Championship, he played the trombone in the high school band and orchestra. After completing high school, Homer attended Ohio State University, graduating with an Aeronautical Engineering degree. He took a job with McDonnell Aircraft and moved to Saint Louis, MO. McDonnell merged with the Douglas Aircraft Company in the mid-1960s, becoming McDonnell Douglass Corporation.

Homer moved to the Atlanta area in 1966, accepting a new position with Lockheed Georgia Company. Lockheed later merged with the Martin Marietta Corporation, becoming Lockheed Martin in 1995. During his time with the company, he worked on many projects including the C130 and C5 transport aircrafts, but his favorite was the YF-22 fighter
